RACING NEWS AT BYC FOR 2009

The **Baddeck 100th Anniversary (1908 – 2008) Trophy** was awarded for the first time in 2008. This beautiful trophy is a gift from the Village of Baddeck to the Bras d'Or Yacht Club in recognition of the great history of recreational sailing in and around the Baddeck area on the beautiful Bras d'Or Lakes.

The trophy will be presented to the yacht with the best overall score from regattas held in Cape Breton each summer. The qualifying regattas and the scoring system used to determine the winner will be formulated each year by the Bras d'Or Yacht Club Regatta Committee.

The inaugural event was in 2008 and the cup was awarded to **Yarra**, owned by **Dr. Arthur Coakley** of Baddeck.

The **Silver Dart 100th Anniversary Trophy** will be award for the first time this year, 2009, in a new competition using the **Seabird** daysailer, a boat that carries 3 crew. It has a main, jib, and spinnaker. There will be four of these boats available for BYC Regatta Week this year. This will be a unique and exciting competition for 2009. 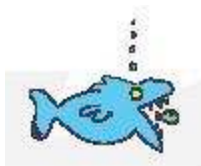

GETTING IN SHAPE FOR RACE SEASON

The breeze is feeling warmer. The days are growing longer. The tarps are coming off. Maybe you've been thinking about bottom paint. Here's a list of other things you can do to help you get in shape.

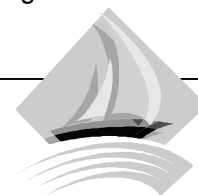
1. Buy a case of beer, sit with it in a very warm place for 3 hours then drink it.
2. Apply sunscreen to your face in streaks and sit in front of a sun lamp for 2 hours
3. Sit on a bench with sharp metal edges digging into the backs of your knees for 2 hours and stare up into the sun. For a more robust workout, invite 4 friends to come over and shout at you at 5-minute intervals.
4. Go out and get very drunk, sleep for 2 hours then stand on a rocking chair for 4 hours.
5. Go to the bank, withdraw \$1,000 then light it on fire.
6. Sit in front of a large commercial fan and have someone throw large buckets of water at you.
7. Repeat number 6 in jeans and sweatshirt. Keep head turned sideways to ensure water lodges fully into eardrum.
